WORK EXPERIENCE

July 1, 2004 to Present: Project Coordinator Bachelor of Science in Addiction Studies Program, University of Central Arkansas, Department of Health Sciences.

Duties include but are not limited to: Instructor in the degree program, teaching 9 hours per semester. Grant writing and subsequent management and coordination of any grants obtained. The BS in Addiction Studies is the only BS of its kind in the State and as a new program the scope changes over time.

May 8, 2000 to June 30, 2004, Area Manager for Treatment, Arkansas Department of Community Correction.

Duties include but not limited to the management and clinical supervision of twenty-seven Post Adjudication Drug Courts and the Field Services Outpatient Substance Abuse Education Program (FSOSAEP). This includes the creation of policy and procedures in keeping with the State of Arkansas' licensure standards for Substance Abuse Programs. The clinical supervision includes supervising all counselors in training and moving them through the Certification Process. The FSOSAEP consists of 21 Substance Abuse Program Leaders stationed in area probation and parole officers and two Day Reporting Centers who facilitate a variety of substance abuse education groups. The total number of staff supervised is approximately 50 (including two assistant area managers).

October 4, 1999 - May 8, 2000 Adult Probation/Parole Officer, 6th Judicial District, Department of Community Punishment, Post Adjudication Drug Court.

Duties include but not limited to: creation and implementation of all substance abuse treatment programs, organization of probation aspect of the program, implementation of random drug screening program, filling vacant staff positions, arranging for a variety of maintenance tasks to be performed, in effect, creating a functioning drug court from the ground up. Arranging for probation and parole officers working toward their certification as alcohol and drug counselors to rotate through the Drug Court to add to their experience and obtain clinical supervision. Continued with the training functions I was fulfilling while in the Conway Probation Office

May 18, 1987 - October 1, 1999- Adult Probation Officer 20th Judicial District (Faulkner, Van Buren and Searcy Counties), Arkansas Department of Community Correction.

Over the course of employment as a probation officer, in addition to the standard duties associated with the position, the caseload evolved to almost exclusively drug involved/dependent offenders. This type of offender not only requires the more traditional type of supervision, but also assessment, rather extensive counseling, referral to outside services and a more intensive level of contact and supervision.

I have served as a trainer to both Probation and Parole Officers and Residential Supervisors in the areas of offender supervision and addictions since the Fall of 1988. Specifically, as a trainer in the Therapeutic Community training for field officers and residential staff. Additionally, teaching Ethics Course for field officers and Counseling the Offender with an emphasis on supervision of the addicted offender. Treatment in a Secure Environment is presented to the Residential Supervisor's Basic Class.

February 1997 - April, 2001 - Director Faulkner County Detention Facility Substance Abuse Education Program

At the request of the Faulkner County Sheriff, the Faulkner County Detention Facility Substance Abuse Treatment Program was implemented. This is done in co-operation with the Arkansas Department of Corrections. Duties included the creation of program curriculum and structure, supervision of the Counseling staff, client screening and final admission approval and various administrative duties.

July 1, 1993 - June 30, 1994 - Administrator 20th Judicial District Circuit Court Treatment Alternatives to Street Crime program

This was funded by a federal Drug Law Enforcement Program grant. In addition to writing the grant I served as administrator of the program, ensuring that the various grant requirements were complied with and the standards associated with the TASC program were maintained. This included writing of policy and procedure in keeping with not only the Federal grant requirements but also consistent with State and County requirements. A coordinator was hired and supervised for the duration of the grant in addition to the requisite statistical evaluation.
